NEW ACADEMMIC YEAR, 2024-2025 INAUGURATED

The New Academic Year 2024-2025 was inaugurated on 1 August 2024. The day began with the Holy Mass presided over by Archbishop John Moolachira, the President of Northeastern Regional Bishops Council (NEIRBC) and the Moderator of OTI. He also blessed and inaugurated the newly renovated Auditorium in the presence of Most Rev. Victor Lyngdoh, the Archbishop of Shillong, the Chief Guest, and others dignitaries and invitees. Rev. Dr. Graviour Augustine, the Director of the Institute, presented the Annual Report of the Academic Year 2023-2024. During the Function, both the Archbishops spoke on the importance of the Spiritual and the Intellectual formation towards priesthood.

The Archbishop Hubert D'Rosario Award was awarded to Fr. Lamkupar Shangdiar from the batch of 2019-2023, from the Diocese of Nongstoin, and to Fr. Prince Kujur of Diphu Diocese for the batch of 2020-2023, for their overall academic performance.











Under the patronage of Rev. Fr. Thomas Manjaly, Scripture Professor of Oriens Theological Institute, a newly instituted award named St. Jerome Award for Excellence in Biblical Studies was awarded to Fr. Phidalis Phawa, from the Diocese of Jowai for his consistent excellence in all examinations of Biblical subjects. It was followed by an Inaugural Lecture delivered by Rev. Dr. Sunny Keemattam, SJ, Principal, St. Xavier's College, and Umoid. He spoke on the theme of "The Depth Dimension in the Intellectual Formation of the Church Leader." 

EXTENSION LECTURE ORGANIZED

The Institute organized the programme with the help of Rev. Fr. Dr. Jose Palakeel, MST. It was attended by all the students of the institute, the teaching staff and the supporting staff. Everyone witnessed the life and struggles of the Blessed Rani Maria in that movie. The Malayalam Movie, dubbed in to English, is based on the true story of Blessed Rani Maria, FCC (Franciscan Clarist Congregation), a nun who dedicated her life to women's empowerment and was murdered on 25 February 1995. It was an inspiring movie which highlighted the power of forgiveness and the importance of standing up for the marginalized. On its successful completion a discussion was held and interaction with the producer who was present. Oriens Theological Institute expressed its gratitude to the Director for making such a Movie.





In his presidential address, Archbishop John Moolachira, President, NEIRBC, emphasized the significance of the creative thinking in responding to the realities of our time. In the keynote address Most Rev. Vincent Aind, the Archbishop of Ranchi, highlighted the different witnessing trends in the Church history of India and said that "today the World needs our involvement so that it can become a better place to live in."




platform for theological reflection and engagement on the theme. Lasting for three days, the presentation by many scholars on various topics was highly educative and was appreciated by all.
